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what exactly is a best boy or a grip as the credits roll at the end of every film listing the names of all the individuals

who contributed to its making many viewers have no idea what these people do this book reveals the mystery behind the job titles as crew members tell their stories explaining what their jobs are how they came to have a career in filmmaking and their many experiences both serious and comic the author has conducted interviews with 33 accredited members of film production crews from many different american and british films each interview includes a brief introduction to the person as well as their filmography examples of individuals interviewed include an assistant director a best boy a boom operator a foley artist a grip a set decorator a storyboard artist and a wrangler

film censorship has always been a controversial matter particularly in jurisdictions with restrictive state based censorship systems this book reviews the film censorship system in the asia pacific by comparing the systems used in malaysia hong kong and australia it identifies the key issues and concerns that arise from the design and implementation of the system by examining the censorship laws policies guidelines and processes the book evaluates film practitioners and censors opinion of and experience in dealing with those issues and goes on to develop reform proposals for the film censorship system

this is the fully comprehensive account of film production in the third world although they are usually ignored or marginalized in histories of world cinema third world countries now produce well over half of the world s films arnes places this huge output in a wider context examining the forces of tradition and colonialism that have shaped the third world in addition to charting filmic developments too little known in europe and the united states the book calls into question many of the assumptions that shape conventional film history it stresses the role of distribution in defining and limiting production queries simplistic notions of independent national cinemas and points to the need to take social and economic factors into account when considering authorship in cinema above all the book celebrates the

achievements of a mass of largely unknown film makers who in difficult circumstances have distinctively expanded our definitions of the art of cinema

compiled by two skilled librarians and a taiwanese film and culture specialist this volume is the first multilingual and most comprehensive bibliography of taiwanese film scholarship designed to satisfy the broad interests of the modern researcher the second book in a remarkable three volume research project an annotated bibliography for taiwan film studies catalogues the published and unpublished monographs theses manuscripts and conference proceedings of taiwanese film scholars from the 1950s to 2013 paired with an annotated bibliography for chinese film studies 2004 which accounts for texts dating back to the 1920s this series brings together like no other reference the disparate voices of chinese film scholarship charting its unique intellectual arc organized intuitively the volume begins with reference materials bibliographies cinematographies directories indexes dictionaries and handbooks and then moves through film history the colonial period taiwan dialect film new taiwan cinema the 2 28 incident film genres animated anticomunist documentary ethnographic martial arts teen film reviews film theory and technique interdisciplinary studies taiwan and mainland china taiwan and japan film and aboriginal peoples film and literature film and nationality biographical materials film stories screenplays and scripts film technology and miscellaneous aspects of taiwanese film scholarship artifacts acts of censorship copyright law distribution channels film festivals and industry practice works written in multiple languages include transliteration romanized and original script entries which follow universal aacr 2

and american cataloguing standards and professional notations by the editors to aid in the use of sources

James Cameron b 1954 is lauded as one of the most successful and innovative filmmakers of the last thirty years his films often break records both in their massive budgets and in their box office earnings they include such hits as *The Terminator* *Aliens* *The Abyss* *Titanic* and *Avatar* part scientist part dramatist Cameron combines these two qualities into inventive and captivating films that often push the boundaries of special effects to accommodate his imagination *James Cameron Interviews* chronicles the writer director's rise through the Hollywood system highlighted by his can-do attitude and his insatiable drive to make the best film possible as a young boy growing up in Canada Cameron imagined himself an astronaut a deep sea explorer a science fiction writer or a filmmaker transplanted to Southern California he would go on to realize many of those boyhood fantasies this collection of interviews provides glimpses of the filmmaker as he advances from Roger Corman's underling to king of the world the interviews are drawn from a number of sources including TV appearances and conversations on blogs which have never been published in print spanning more than twenty years this collection constructs a concise and thorough examination of Cameron a filmmaker who has almost single handedly ushered Hollywood into the twenty first century

Fans and critics alike perceive Wong Kar Wai b 1958 as an enigma his dark glasses his nonlinear narrations and his high expectations for actors all contribute to an assumption that he only makes art for a few high brow critics however

wong s interviews show this hong kong auteur is candid about the art of filmmaking even surprising his interlocutors by suggesting his films are commercial and made for a popular audience wong s achievements nevertheless feel like art house cinema his third film chungking express introduced him to a global audience captivated by the quick and quirky editing style his cannes award winning films happy together and in the mood for love confirmed an audience beyond the greater chinese market his latest film the grandmaster depicts the life of a kung fu master by breaking away from the martial arts genre in each of these films wong kar wai s signature style experimental emotive character driven and timeless remains apparent throughout this volume includes interviews that appear in english for the first time including some that appeared in hong kong magazines now out of print the interviews cover every feature film from wong s debut as tears go by to his 2013 the grandmaster

interviews with the film critic and director who was a key figure in the french new wave

collected interviews with the quirky and distinctive writer director team of such films as raising arizona intolerable cruelty and barton fink

james bawden seeing the way people behave when they re around you is it still fun being cary grant cary grant i don t like to disappoint people because he s a completely made up character and i m playing a part it s a part i ve been playing a long time but no way am i really cary grant a friend told me once i always wanted to be cary grant and i said so did i from the book in conversations with classic film stars retired journalists james bawden and ron miller present an astonishing collection of rare interviews with the greatest celebrities of hollywood s golden age conducted over the course of more than fifty years they recount intimate conversations with some of the most famous leading men and women of the era including douglas fairbanks jr joseph cotten cary grant gloria swanson joan fontaine loretta young

kirk douglas and many more each interview takes readers behind the scenes with some of cinema's most iconic stars the actors convey unforgettable stories from maureen o'hara discussing charles laughton's request that she change her last name to bob hope candidly commenting on the presidential honors bestowed upon him humorous enlightening and poignant conversations with classic film stars is essential reading for anyone who loves classic movies
